Parish Council Actions

- The Parish Council need a new website to comply with the Web Accessibility Regulations and have agreed a new provider. Details of the new site will be sent out as soon as it is up and running.
- The Parish Council has discussed with TMBC whether more litter bins can be installed in the village. It is understood that the cost of installing the bin and emptying it will have to be paid by the Parish Council. Unfortunately, TMBC are not installing new litter bins at the moment.
- The Parish Council are continuing to discuss and consider ways to improve traffic in the village by reducing speed and volume wherever possible.
- Cllr McKinlay has been invited to read the names from the Honour Board and lay a wreath at St Martins Church during the Remembrance Service on behalf of the Parish Council.
- A broken streetlight on one of the traffic calming islands on Birling Road has been reported to our contractor.
- Councillors have agreed to plant wildflowers at the junction with The Street and Roughetts Road by the Village Sign and are submitting an application to be able to do this to Kent Highways.
