### **September Parish Council Meeting**

- Cllr McKinlay and the Clerk met with Tom Tugendhat MP and Highways England (now National Highways) about 2 years ago concerning noise from the M20 Smart Motorway. National Highways have formally responded and in their view, vegetation makes no difference. They will not take any further action.
- Cllrs agreed that the Notice Board by the Recreation Ground is in a dreadful state. They are
  pleased with the Notice Board installed in Ryarsh Park and the Clerk will look at ordering the
  same colour Notice Board, perhaps with one side locked for the Parish Council and one side
  unlocked for residents.

### Land West of Roughetts Road, Ryarsh

Request for an Environmental Impact Assessment Scoping Opinion to determine the information to be provided in an Environmental Statement to accompany a planning application for the proposed extraction of aggregate (sand) – KCC/SCO/TM/0140/2023 – www.landwestofroughettsroad.co.uk

The Parish Council has responded to KCC to say that villagers are very upset that this has been raised again, and reminding them of all the responses on this. Until we have an official planning application there is not anything we can fight against.

The Parish Council has contacted our MP Tom Tugendhat who supports the village. Cllr McKinlay has also written to Matt Boughton, the leader of TMBC and we have a meeting with the Primary School to discuss.

The developer has set up a website and you can register to receive email updates from them. The process is at stage 1-2 and the developer will arrange for a public consultation to take place.

### **KENT HIGHWAYS**

Cllrs McKinlay and Sutton and the Clerk met with Highways, and progress is being made with the Highways Improvement Plan. Councillors are mindful that there have been accidents on Roughetts Road and hope to find ways to make this road safer.

Traffic Surveys were carried out in the village in May on Woodgate Road and Roughetts Road. In Highways view, there is good compliance with the posted speed limit, and with the majority of drivers driving under the enforcement speed at all three locations.


### **Next Parish Council meeting**

Thursday 5 October	Upper Halling and the lost village of Dode with views over the Medway valley including the Medway bridge, Rochester Castle and Cathedral. Moderate difficulty.	5 miles
Sunday 8 October	From Hever around the Chiding Stone: paths, grassy tracks and field edges, some roads and plenty of local history. Moderate difficulty; about six stiles.	5 miles
Sunday 15 October	Westerham Wandering: climb up from Westerham through the woods towards Chartwell. Good views north to the North Downs. Moderate difficulty.	5.5 miles
Thursday 19 October	An undulating walk from Stansted through woodlands and fields with some road walking. Stunning views over North Kent Downs. Moderate difficulty:	6 miles
Sunday 22 October	Battle of Trafalgar from Victory Wood, south of Whitstable. Walk through ancient woodland and open countryside with coastal views, to explore the sculptures and tree planting associated with the Battle of Trafalgar. Moderate difficulty.	6.7 miles

Sunday 29 October	Birling circular walk along quiet lanes and footpaths with a gentle ascent to the North Downs Way. Moderate difficulty.	5.5 miles
